





























New Jersey vs. United States, Labor Force Participation Rate: August 2018 - August 2019




Unemployed New Jersey Residents August 2018 - August 2019






New Jersey Counties Unemployment Rates - July 2019

(Preliminary, Not Seasonally Adjusted)




New Jersey Counties Unemployed Residents - July 2019

(Preliminary, Not Seasonally Adjusted)




New Jersey Counties Labor Force Per Square Mile - July 2019
