































New Jersey vs. United States, Labor Force Participation Rate: June 2018 - June 2019











New Jersey Counties Unemployment Rates - May 2019

(Preliminary, Not Seasonally Adjusted)




New Jersey Counties Unemployed Residents - May 2019

(Preliminary, Not Seasonally Adjusted)




New Jersey Counties Labor Force Per Square Mile - May 2019
