Success is never accidental – Jack Dorsey

We had a lot going on before all of this started going on! As Program Year 2019 comes to a close, we would like to share with you one of our stories of success.

Ben came to the Youth Employment Services (YES) program as a high school drop with no clear picture of what his next steps would be in his career journey. Being young and impulsive, when we first met with Ben, all he wanted to do was buy a plane ticket to fly out to Colorado and start a new life there. While we appreciated his enthusiasm for a fresh start in a new place, we wanted to ensure that he had a realistic and solid plan in place instead of moving across the country without a focus and without a reliable source of income. We wanted to ensure his success, as we could see he had the determination and the drive needed to be successful in a brand-new environment.

In initial conversations with Ben, he revealed that he had an interest in working in film production, as he had been involved in a film club while still enrolled in high school. After spending some time with Ben, we were able to get him to recognize the value in obtaining his high school equivalency and its importance as a good first step towards eventually enrolling in film school. Ben enrolled in the Workfirst Learning Link and after several months of classes and steadfast commitment and dedication, he proudly walked away with a high school equivalency diploma.

With this major goal achieved, Ben was referred to the Visions program at Middle Earth. It was here that he not only learned soft skills that would give him a foundation for future employment but where he also earned a certification in Apple Final Cut Pro that would serve as a first step on his career journey. While in the Visions program, Ben had the opportunity to do an internship that allowed him to work on video marketing material. This solidified his resolve to go to film school where he could pursue his passion.

The YES program continued to work closely with Ben to support him through his application process to the school of his dreams in Colorado. Ben was overjoyed when he was accepted and together, we began to plan for his move out of state. He lined up part time employment that would sustain him while he attended school. He now had all the pieces in place and when he finally boarded the plane to Colorado, we were confident that he was on solid footing and would hit the ground running when he landed.

The YES program continues to follow up with Ben, who has found a new home with his peers in film school. He has also made strong connections through his part time employment that will serve him well into the future. Ben continues to thank the YES program for providing the patience, support and guidance he so desperately needed after withdrawing from high school. We know that great things lie ahead for Ben and we hope to one day see his name in the credits scroll across the silver screen!

The month of Junewas spent planning with Human Services and coordinating with the County on a plan for a safe return to the office for both staff and our customers. Beginning on July 13th, One Stop staff will be returning to the office on a staggered schedule through the end of August to allow for appropriate social distancing requirements. While County offices will at first remain closed the public, the One Stop will continue to provide all of its services remotely, as it has successfully done since stay-at-home orders were issued by the State back in March.

As our new work environment continues to evolve, updates on our plan will be provided to the GRWDB.

The One Stop staff is looking forward to returning to the office in July!
