Connections with Communities of Faith

When folks are in need, it can be hard to reach out and ask for assistance directly from a community agency, especially if the person seeking services does not already have an established relationship with a local provider. People often turn to those who they trust and who have been there to provide them support and guidance through tumultuous times in their lives, such as family and friends. Communities of faith also play a large role in the lives of many. When going through challenging times, folks often turn to their place of worship for not only spiritual direction, but for concrete services that many faith communities provide such as food and clothing and pre-school and literacy classes. Faith communities also do amazing work connecting those in need with other services that will help to provide stability in their lives. Because we recognize the rich resource we have in our communities of faith, this April, the One Stop mailed packets of information on our services to 239 places of worship across Hunterdon County and Somerset County so that can refer those seeking employment to us and we can help them navigate the winding path of their career journey wherever it may lead!

The One Stop staff conducted its quarterly time study in April. Time studies track the work that each staff member accomplishes each day and is important in the budget process. Time studies determine the allocation of funds across our WFNJ, Adult, Dislocated Worker and Youth grants and are an integral part developing an updated Cost Allocation Plan (CAP).



As part of National County Government Month, marketing materials for services offered through the Greater Raritan One Stop were on display April 5th through April 12th at the Somerset County Board of Commissioners booth at the Bridgewater Library. *County Government Works for You!*



In partnership with the Somerset County Library System, the Greater Raritan One Stop participated in a project with a Somerville Library social work intern who was gathering information on local social services. Resources were being compiled and shared with library staff and future interns so that service information could be shared with library patrons. We were happy to talk about the myriad of free services we have to offer to job seekers through the One Stop!












Defeating Unconscious Bias: 5 Strategies

Let's face it, everybody has some unconscious bias. This is not in the context of talking about a preference for Mexican food or an inclination toward the color blue. The focus here is on those inflexible beliefs about whole categories of people that keep us from seeing others accurately, from making fair and appropriate decisions, and from building the kind of harmonious relationships that make our lives more successful.

Clearly, biases are bad news. On the other hand, the good news is that biases do not make us bad people. Human nature is to lump people into categories. Because of this predisposition, we are vulnerable to unconsciously believing the messages that bombard us from family, media, experience, and society as a whole. But we are not stuck with our unconscious biases; we can defeat them.

The "Defeating Unconscious Bias" workshop is designed to address the hidden biases that can affect hiring, team building and challenges the ability to create inclusivity in both professional and personal settings. A 14 minute video accompanies this training offering 5 simple, actionable, and memorable strategies to enhance workplace productivity and innovation by addressing bias. The authenticity and diversity of the scenarios utilized keeps participants attention, and the solutions suggested support change without blame.


