

Supportive Service Funding Check In

WIOA requires that supportive services be used to assist job seekers in overcoming barriers to employment. Supportive services can range from labor market information, resume and interview assistance, and can also include financial support such as transportation, exam/certification fees, childcare, and more.

The One-Stop has always provided supportive services as required under WIOA, but over the past two program years we now have a Greater Raritan Workforce Development policy and the funding to provide much needed financial support to purchase items and services to support job seekers in training and in obtaining self-sufficient employment.

Since PY21, approximately \$2,227.00 has been used to support the purchase of books, HSE/GED vouchers, indemand certification/test fees, and transportation for 22 individuals in Somerset & Hunterdon counties.



One-Stop Training Center Staff Obtain NAWDP Certification

Congratulations One-Stop staff for receiving news that all staff, both direct service and administrative, have been awarded the Certified Workforce Development Professional (CWDP) certification. This certification requires staff to independently complete 8 hours of instruction, a series of exams, and a final certification exam. It also required a minimum of 1 year experience working within the field of workforce development.

According to the National Association of Workforce Development Professionals, the CWDP has "been validated by professionals across the nation in a variety of workforce settings as representative of the skills and competencies required for success in the industry".

The One-Stop often encourages customers to obtain industry recognized credentials to show employers they have the competencies required for the job. In this case, the CWDP certification shows customers that One-Stop staff have the competencies required to best support them.

One-Stop staff have the connections to the **local community**, knowledge of the **regional economy**, and now recognized as meeting **national workforce development professional standards**.

Somerset and Hunterdon County residents who are under or unemployed have a wealth of services available to them. Services include career and vocational counseling, job-related training in-demand occupations, veterans' benefits, reentry services and a full service job outplacement center called the One-Stop Career Center.

The Greater Raritan One-Stop Career Center is staffed with qualified professionals who can assist with obtaining employment and the training needed to meet the demands of the present workforce. Other services include, on-the-job training with local employers and apprenticeships in many fields.
