Health Care Highlights


- 2023 Health Care: 25,000 establishments employed over 500,000 workers
- Gross Domestic Product: \$52.8 billion (8.8% of total output)
- Average Annual Wage: \$74,300 (8.1% below state average)
- Total Wages Paid: \$37.3 billion (12.6% of all wages paid)
- Unique Employment Trend: Growth in every year since 1990 except 2020,
 largely influenced by the COVID-19 pandemic




New Jersey's health care contributions to Real GDP exceeded \$52.8 billion in 2023









Nationwide health care contributions to Real GDP exceeded \$1.6 trillion in 2023








New Jersey's health care employment has more than doubled since 1990



*Gray area denotes U.S. economic recession as defined by the National Bureau of Economic Research (NBER)




National health care employment has also doubled since 1990









Health care employment has shifted from hospitals towards ambulatory care








Top five industries account for 70 percent of all health care employment



The map shows a ratio of one health care worker by county, highlighting the density of the health care workforce relative


to population




New Jersey is home to 75 hospitals, serving the state's

The map illustrates that residential care facilities tend to cluster in regions with higher concentrations of older residents



Two-thirds of workers were directly involved with patient care in 2023








Half of all employment in ambulatory care services requires at least a bachelor's degree






Half of all occupational employment in hospitals requires at least an associate's degree






Half of all employment at nursing and residential care facilities requires no more than a high school education





Nine of the top ten highest paying occupations in health care require a doctoral degree






Most of the workforce (85%) is 25 to 64 years old
