# Fall Healthcare Recruitment Set at Hunterdon Chamber

Dozens of jobs available right now at healthcare businesses in Hunterdon and Somerset counties will be featured at a Thursday, September 25, in-person Multi-Employer Healthcare Recruitment Event.

This focused career fair, presented by the New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development and the Greater Raritan Workforce Development Board (GRWDB), will be conducted from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. in the Hunterdon County Chamber of Commerce Center for Business & Entrepreneurship, 119 Main St. Flemington.



### Get Free Training

The GRWDB and the New Jersey Manufacturing Extension Program are collaborating on a New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development Opportunity Partnership Grant that provides free online training in manufacturing.

Hunterdon and Somerset County residents are invited to learn more by joining one in a series of OPG Manufacturing Program Information The sessions will be conducted at 11 a.m. September 3, September 10, September 17, September 24 and October 1, virtually and in-person at the GRWDB office at 27 Warren St., Somerville.

The GRWDB OPG Program is designed for dislocated workers and underemployed individuals who are interested in starting a new manufacturing career. The program allows eligible participants to get an OSHA-10 certificate in safety standards and receive a certification for Certified Manufacturing Associate in fundamental production know-how. The 12-hour OSHA online class and the 25- to 30-hour online training program from Tooling U-SME introduce basic concepts in the areas needed to begin a successful entry-level manufacturing career.

Information sessions began in April for this new initiative, and the first cohort of eight trainees completed the training in July. A second cohort will begin in early September, and a third cohort will start later in the fall. In all, 30 slots are available. Applicants will work with the OPG Coordinator to complete eligibility papers. After approved for the training, credential instruction will be provided in cohorts.

## Summer Youth Work Experience Program continues to grow

Now in its sixth year, Greater Raritan's Summer Youth Work Experience Program has given young people from Hunterdon and Somerset counties opportunities to get real-world skills while supporting local employers.

In 2025, 94 youth participants are finishing up their experiences up from 83 in 2024. Participants begia from late May to early July, and all will be done by mid-September. They worked with 36 employers in a range of industries and organizations.

For this year's program, each participant was required to complete up to 180 hours of on-site work and 20 hours of job-readiness training. Participants receive a \$17/hour tax-free stipend totaling up to \$3,400.00 based upon their completed hours. The job-readiness training hours included an hour orientation, a two-hour in person program and a one-hour virtual job coaching session provided by training consultant Jean Trujillo, and 16 hours of online course work on SkillUp Metrix Learning designed for the program.

This year's employers include several divisions from Somerset County government: Information Technology Department, Clerk's Office, the Clerk of the Board Commissioners Office, Administrator's Office, Prosecutor's Office, Public Works Office, Human Resources, Volunteer Services, Health Department, and 4-H.

Other employers are Adult Center Day County, Assemblyman Erik Peterson's Office, Aurora Kitchens & Design, Bernardsville Library, Franklin Grace Resource Center, Greater Somerset County YMCA, Hillsborough Township, America's Grow-A-Row, Hunterdon Chamber of Commerce, Hunterdon Vocationa District, the JCC, of Somerset, Hunterdon and Warren Counties, LK Tutor Pros, Montgomery Township, Somerset Community Action Program, WeBBits, Emergi-Clean, Sounds of Tomorrow Academy, Feeding Hands, Hunterdon County Educational Services Commission, Readington Township, Vison Development Group, and Visions and Pathways.



Gabriella Cardoso of North Plainfield was a Summer Youth Work Experience participant in 2024, placed in the Somerset County Clerk of the Board Office. This year, she was hired to be the Navigator for the 2025 cohort, assisting in outreaching to and gathering information from the 94 participants. Cardoso is studying pre-law at Seton Hall.

The employers are in the process of completing performance evaluations. Overwhelmingly the youth were successful in their work experience, while the employers felt participant input was positive for their organizations. Seven program participants were placed at the Franklin-Township based Sounds of Tomorrow Academy, which specializes in audio engineering, artist development, videography, and podcasting.

As part of their experience, participants facilitated a vending table at the August Franklin Township Night Out event, allowing them to engage with the community while put their marketing skills into practice. In addition to running the table, some participants performed at the event while others created a video showcasing their videography, editing, music production, and audio design skills.

# One-Stop Operator Update



As we continue our commitment to supporting job seekers in their career journeys, we are excited to share key updates designed to enhance the services and resources available to partners and those we serve.

In July, we introduced a **co-enrollment matrix**, that encompasses all Greater Raritan One-Stop partners, detailing the range of services and resources they offer. This tool equips our case managers and navigators to better guide and encourage co-enrollment opportunities, ensuring that those being served have access to the support necessary for career growth. The matrix, above, is linked on the **GRWDB Partners website page** and includes links to websites for the various highlighted services.

The matrix is designed to be a living resource and will be updated as needed to reflect new partners and changes in services.

Additionally, we are updating our partner Memorandums of Understanding (MOU). A July meeting with our partners allowed us to gather valuable feedback and explore the possibility of welcoming new partners into our system. This collaborative effort ensures that our support network remains dynamic, responsive, and tailored to the evolving needs of our job seekers. The current MOU, developed in 2023, is available here on the GRWDB website, and the revised MOU will be posted by the beginning of October.

We encourage other local and regional service agencies to consider enrolling in the Greater Raritan One-Stop system, where a dedicated team and a robust network of resources are ready to work together to support the career aspirations of residents and businesses and bring economic opportunity to Hunterdon and Somerset Counties.

# Fall Literacy classes are set

Fall classes are beginning in October for First Steps Basic English, free English-language earning program for residents of Somerset County. program, funded Somerset County Board Commissioners through American Rescue Plan, funds is part of the free adult literacy programs for Englishlanguage learners in Hunterdon and Somerset Counties.

First Steps Basic English has served 383 individuals since being launched as a pilot in September 2023. For the classes and small will be offered instruction Bernardsville, Bound Brook, Franklin Hills-borough, Manville, Township, North Plainfield, Raritan Borough and Somerville, as well as on Zoom. Classes are run by partners from the Literacy Volunteers of Somerset County, Hunterdon County Educational Services Commission and Raritan Valley Community College. Additional ARP funding allocated by the Somerset County Commissioners will allow the program to continue through 2026.
