The Greater Raritan One-Stop has implemented a strategic recruitment initiative aimed at enhancing workforce engagement through the organization of quarterly, sector-specific events. These events feature on-site interviews and screenings, providing valuable opportunities for job-seekers and employers alike.

- Somerset: January 29 and July 23
- Hunterdon: April 23 and October 29

In acknowledgment of his exceptional contributions to the community, Paul Grzella, Director of the Greater Raritan Workforce Development Board, will be honored at the GSETA Conference in Atlantic City with the 2025 New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development Community and Outreach Award. His dedication to collaborating with local organizations has significantly improved services for underserved populations, demonstrating a commendable commitment to community development.

The recruitment event on September 26, 2025, in Flemington attracted 38 job-seekers. We achieved 5 job offers and await updated placement outcomes.

Success Stories

When Maria first came to the Greater Raritan One-Stop Career Training Services Center, she was unsure of her next steps and felt uncertain about which direction to take in her career. Maria had been out of work since 2023, after leaving her job at a local supermarket. Although she was unable to collect unemployment benefits, she did receive SNAP assistance through the Board of Social Services.

During career counseling sessions, Maria's career navigator recognized that she had been unemployed for quite some time. Despite being out of the workforce for over a year, Maria was determined and motivated to get back on track. One thing that stood out was her strong organizational skills. She mentioned that she might enjoy working in a warehouse environment. After discussing options, her career navigator recommended she explore the Certified Supply Chain Professional (CSCP) training program at Rutgers Center for Continuing Professional Development. This program would allow her to put her organizational strengths to use while opening the door to warehouse and logistics career opportunities with strong growth potential.

Together, Maria and her career navigator gathered the necessary documents for her WIOA grant application. Her navigator stayed connected with her throughout the process, offering encouragement while she worked hard to complete the training. This was a major step forward, navigating a career change while carving out her own path. Her biggest challenge was finding a quiet place to study. To overcome this, she often used the One-Stop's Career Training Services Center's quiet spaces or visited the local library. With limited access to transportation, she relied heavily on family and friends to help her get where she needed to go. Maria's persistence paid off. She successfully completed the Certified Supply Chain Professional CSCP program and soon after secured employment as a Logistics Coordinator with a regional company. Her salary allowed her to secure reliable transportation as well as housing and food security.


Maria's journey is a clear example of how determination, the right training, and the support of the Greater Raritan One-Stop Career Training Services Center can lead to meaningful career opportunities.


Success Stories

Carl had been out of work for over a year when he came to the One-Stop Career Training Services Center to learn about available resources. He had previously been employed as a teacher and was working toward a special education certification but was unable to complete it due to circumstances that placed him out of the workforce.

The Community Outreach Specialist at the One-Stop Career Training Services Center assisted by revising Carl's résumé, which initially needed significant improvement. Because he had been collecting disability benefits, WIOA funding could not be used for the certification. Recognizing this barrier, the One-Stop Career Training Services Center referred Carl to the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation Services (DVRS) and communicated directly with a representative there to ensure he was connected with the appropriate services.

With a stronger résumé, Carl began receiving positive responses from employers and had a successful meeting with DVRS. DVRS provided funding for the training required to complete his certification and he is actively engaged in his program. Carl's story highlights the importance of the strong connection between the One-Stop Career Training Services Center and DVRS. By working together, the two agencies were able to align resources, remove barriers, and ensure he accessed the right training and support—ultimately leading to successful employment and a fresh start in his career.

The OPG Program is designed for dislocated workers and underemployed individuals who are interested in starting a new manufacturing career. Applicants will work with the OPG Coordinator and the Greater Raritan One-Stop Career Center to complete eligibility documentation. Approved students will receive instruction and progress through cohorts directly from an instructor providing the teachings for the credential. The courses are accessible anytime, anywhere and will be supported by in-person assistance. Those who complete the program will be prepared for interviews with companies hiring in Hunterdon and Somerset Counties.


