### **Upcoming Event Overview:**

The Greater Raritan One-Stop will host a Somerset County recruitment event on January 29, 2026, from 10:00 AM to 12:00 PM at 27 Warren Street, Somerville, NJ. The event is designed to efficiently employ as many jobseekers as possible within a two-hour window by condensing candidate review, interviewing, and job offer processes.

#### **Event Focus:**

- Supporting vulnerable populations in the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation Services (DVRS) and the New Jersey Commission of the Blind and Visually Impaired (NJCBVI).
- Tailored recruitment based on job preferences and qualifications collected from DVRS and NJCBVI clients.
- Employer participation coordinated by the New Jersey Department of Labor Business Service team to align openings with client needs.
- On-site interviews available for pre-registered jobseekers.
- TANF, GA, and SNAP clients in the Work First New Jersey (WFNJ) program are also encouraged to pre-register.

#### Pre-Registration:

- Jobseekers must complete the online registration form (expected to open in early January) for on-site interview consideration.
- Event is open to all jobseekers, including those outside of the Greater Raritan area of Hunterdon and Somerset Counties.
